This Patrol book is designed to help you become a more organized focused leader. As a leader, it will help you plan for events, track necessary tasks, keep up with important information, and to jog your memory.

As a scout, it will help you follow along with how the leaders do things, and keep track of what you need to do as a scout. It will also help you to be ready for that important day when you will need to jump in there and be the patrol leader without any notice!

### TIPS FOR KEEPING YOUR BOOK

- Write with a #2 pencil w/eraser (blunt tip)
- Protect your patrol book from the weather
- Dry the pages if they get wet
- Reinforce the page holes if needed
- Add, remove, or reorganize pages to fit your missions

## 10 Patrol Leader Tips

- 1 Keep Your Word.** Don't make promises you can't keep.
- 2 Be Fair to All.** A good leader shows no favorites. Don't allow friendships to keep you from being fair to all members of your patrol. Know who likes to do what, and assign duties to patrol members by what they like to do.
- 3 Be a Good Communicator.** You don't need a commanding voice to be a good leader, but you must be willing to step out front with an effective "Let's go." A good leader knows how to get and give information so that everyone understands what's going on.
- 4 Be Flexible.** Everything doesn't always go as planned. Be prepared to shift to "plan B" when "plan A" doesn't work.
- 5 Be Organized.** The time you spend planning will be repaid many times over. At patrol meetings, record who agrees to do each task, and fill out the duty roster before going camping.
- 6 Delegate.** Some leaders assume that the job will not get done unless they do it themselves. Most people like to be challenged with a task. Empower your patrol

members to do things they have never tried.

**7 Set an Example.** The most important thing you can do is lead by example. Whatever you do, your patrol members are likely to do the same. A cheerful attitude can keep everyone's spirits up.

**8 Be Consistent.** Nothing is more confusing than a leader who is one way one moment and another way a short time later. If your patrol knows what to expect from you, they will more likely respond positively to your leadership.

**9 Give Praise.** The best way to get credit is to give it away. Often a "Nice job" is all the praise necessary to make a Scout feel he is contributing to the efforts of the patrol.

**10 Ask for Help.** Don't be embarrassed to ask for help. You have many resources at your disposal. When confronted with a situation you don't know how to handle, ask someone with more experience for some advice and direction.

# PATROL LEADER

## CAMPSITE PREPARATION - ON ARRIVAL

\_\_\_\_\_ Dining Fly – 2 scouts

The dining fly is actually the first thing that should be set up. In the event of rain you will need the fly to store the patrol's food and equipment so it doesn't get wet while you set up camp. Two people are just right to set up the poles and fly properly.

\_\_\_\_\_ Hang up the duty rosters!

Duty Roster should already have been completed before leaving ! Let there be no doubt in any one's mind what they have to do! Put the duty rosters where everyone can see them.

\_\_\_\_\_ Tents – 2 to 3 scouts

Assign two to three people to set up the tents. If you are using more than one tent for your patrol then still have the same team put up the tents. Less is more, remember?

\_\_\_\_\_ Gear Stowed

\_\_\_\_\_ Ax Yard – 1 scout (**if assigned by SPL**)

The ax yard should be clearly marked by rope. For safety reasons only one scout should be assigned to the ax yard, and only he should be allowed into the yard. The scout assigned can vary as the need arises.

### \_\_\_\_\_ **Fire – 3 scouts**

Assign two scouts to gather tinder, kindling and firewood. Assign one scout to build the fire lay and to get the fire going.

### \_\_\_\_\_ **Cooking**

If you are doing patrol cooking be sure to have the various jobs worked out on paper before you arrive at camp. You should have every one's job posted for each meal for all to see. The meal jobs should be rotated from meal to meal. If the jobs are not posted, you can be sure that the only thing any one will show up to do will be to eat - and then they will disappear! Blank copies of a short term duty roster are provided here or you can make up your own.

### \_\_\_\_\_ **In General**

One thing that you want to avoid is having too many patrol members trying to do the same job. If you have boys standing around with nothing to do because there are too many of them trying to do the same thing, you will lose their attention. Once you have lost their attention it is very hard to get it back again. Assign jobs so that everyone has something to do as soon as you arrive at the campsite.

### \_\_\_\_\_ **Needs**

Do try to be aware of who needs or wants to work on second or first class requirements. Finally, your tents should be up, gear stowed and fire started (if needed) before you begin any other activities.

## **CAMPSITE JOBS - COOKING**

The jobs that are to be assigned for each meal are as follows:

**COOK** - prepares meals and washes utensils used for preparation.

**ASSISTANT COOK** - Helps cook as requested. Prepares water for dish washing and supervises meal cleanup.

**FIRE** - Cares for and prepares equipment used to cook on and keeps fuel or firewood ready if needed.

**SITE CLEANUP** - Cleans up eating area at campsite and maintains latrine.

**WATER** - Gets drinking water and washes dishes and pots.

If a scout is working on his first class cooking requirement he is to prepare the job roster for cooking on his own. You can give him advice, but let him do the job.

# CAMPSITE INSPECTION

The following is a list of things to look for in your campsite. Some things are for safety and some are for convenience. All are important and will help you and your patrol to have a better time.

## TENTS

\_\_\_\_\_ Was the ground properly prepared?

\_\_\_\_\_ Does each tent have a ground cloth or adequate protection?

\_\_\_\_\_ Are all tents set up properly?

\_\_\_\_\_ Are the insides of the tent neatly arranged?

\_\_\_\_\_ Are sleeping bags stored neatly or airing out?

## FIRES

\_\_\_\_\_ Are all fires at least 15 feet from any tent?

\_\_\_\_\_ Is the ground cleared at least 10 feet from each fire?

\_\_\_\_\_ Is there water and a shovel to put out a fire in the case of an emergency?

\_\_\_\_\_ Is there enough firewood?

\_\_\_\_\_ Is the firewood protected?

## **AXE YARD**

\_\_\_\_\_ Is there a well marked ax yard?

\_\_\_\_\_ Are all cutting tools sharp and stored properly?

## **GENERAL**

\_\_\_\_\_ Is the meal duty roster posted?

\_\_\_\_\_ Has the Troop gear and your Patrol equipment been put in the trailer.

\_\_\_\_\_ Has all garbage been properly disposed of?

\_\_\_\_\_ Is the campsite as pristine or more than when you arrived?

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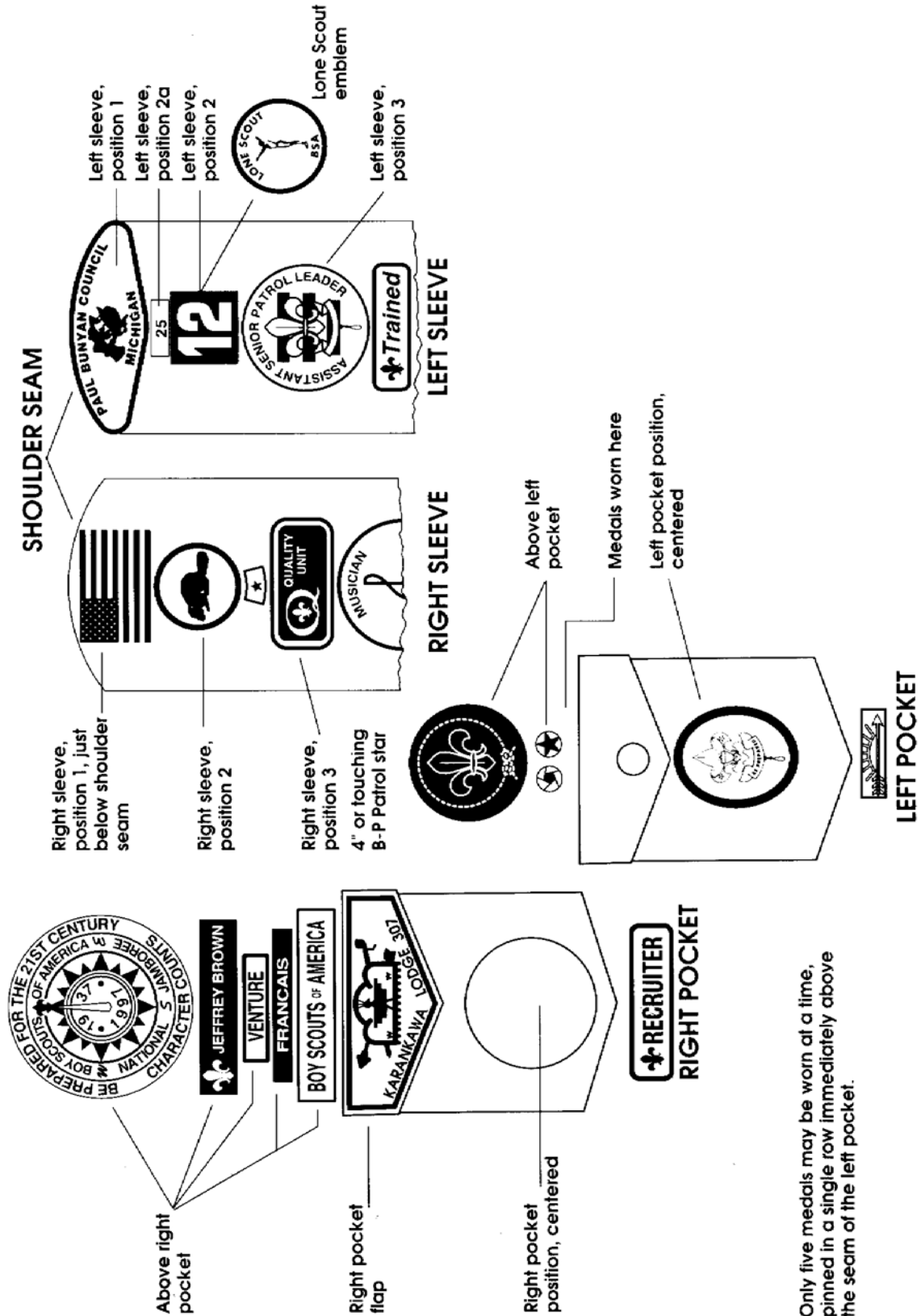

## UPON ARRIVAL

\_\_\_\_\_ SPL selects Ax Yard Location and assigns a Patrol to set it up

\_\_\_\_\_ SPL selects patrol sites with patrol leaders.

### **AFTER ARRIVAL**

\_\_\_\_\_ If required, assigned patrol has dug latrine and set up tarp cover.

- ❖ Toilet paper present at latrine (only for campouts where the troop is not near a latrine).

\_\_\_\_\_ Assigned patrol knows of duties to build and maintain Sat night campfire (only if on campout agenda).

Assigned patrol has dug dirty dishwasher hole.

\_\_\_\_\_ Sat night campfire program is prepared(only if on campout agenda)

\_\_\_\_\_ Patrols assigned skits are preparing skits.

\_\_\_\_\_ SPL meets with patrol leaders to discuss activities for the next day.

\_\_\_\_\_ SPL ensures that patrol are policing areas and cleaning equipment after each meal.

\_\_\_\_\_ SPL ensures that campfire is extinguished all lights are out with Scouts in tents at the designated light out time.

### **CAMPOUT DEPARTURE**

\_\_\_\_\_ SPL ensures that designated patrols have assigned loaders and loadmaster.

\_\_\_\_\_ Loadmaster and loader report to trailer at a time designated by SPL.
